Our goal is to teach children (from 1st to 4th grade) safe behavior in the car: always sit in the back seat, on a specially designed seat, with a properly fastened seat belt.

60 Years of Cinema in the Name of Humanism – Varna Celebrates

The International Festival of Red Cross and Health Films, founded in 1965, marks its 60th anniversary with an inspiring program that unites art, culture, and human values. Once again, Varna, as the host city, becomes a stage for dialogue, solidarity, and commitment to global challenges.

Revived in 2014 through the initiative of the Bulgarian Red Cross and the Medical University of Varna, the festival will hold its 21st edition from June 12 to 20, 2025. The forum is held under the patronage of the Vice President of the Republic of Bulgaria, Iliana Yotova, who will attend the official gala ceremony on June 14.

Under the motto "Humanity Every Day in a Changing World," this year's event emphasizes the power of cinema as a tool for empathy, understanding, and social transformation. In times of challenges to health, the environment, and human dignity, the featured films inspire compassion and open new horizons of hope.

The anniversary edition is visually marked by a special poster created by prominent Bulgarian artist and poster designer Dimitar Traychev, encapsulating the forum's philosophy with the message: "Films Heal the Wounds of the Soul."

The International Festival of Red Cross and Health Films is not merely a cultural event, but a visionary platform for sustainable development and social responsibility. Each year, the festival introduces innovative practices inspired by the spirit of "green festivals": promoting waste reduction, alternative urban mobility, lowering the carbon footprint, and actively involving socially responsible enterprises and environmental initiatives.

Throughout its six-decade history, the forum has remained true to its mission—to place the human being, their health, and dignity at the center of attention. Varna celebrates not just an anniversary, but the sustainable path of cinema in service of humanity.

This year's competition program includes a record-breaking 226 films from 63 countries, selected from over 2,800 submitted productions. Screenings will take place at the Festival and Congress Centre – Varna, and will be divided into four competitive categories: fiction, documentary, Red Cross, and health films. Additional sections focus on ecology, mental health, cultural integration, and the relationship between art and sport.

We dedicate this celebratory edition to all donors and volunteers—those whose dedication and commitment make this cause a reality. We express our heartfelt gratitude for the financial support and broad partnerships from companies and institutions that stand behind the mission of this event.

The anniversary forum is made possible with the support of the Culture Fund – Municipality of Varna, the National Culture Fund, the Recovery and Resilience Plan, as well as through partnerships with the Bulgarian Red Cross and the Medical University of Varna.





Dear participants and guests, Dear festival audience,

It so happened that I am writing these lines on the very International Day of the Red Cross and Red Crescent, when the radio reminded me of the date just as I was sitting down in front of the computer and calculating how many years have passed since Henri Dunant's spontaneous idea, after the bloody battle of Solferino (1859), to organize the people from the surrounding villages and care for the thousands of dead and wounded left on the battlefield.

Today, we all commemorate this memorable day, paying tribute to the millions of volunteers and humanitarian workers who tirelessly help people in need all over the world. It is no coincidence that volunteering is one of the seven purest and most powerful principles of the international Red Cross movement, because humanism, or as we say in Bulgarian – humanity, is the ordinary manifestation of everyday morality, without which our existence loses its meaning. This undeniable truth is most concentrated in the simple verbal motto: "Blood is red everywhere."

These timeless ideas are dedicated to the International Festival of Red Cross and Health Films, which was born here in Varna 60 years ago, and later, rightfully so, received the highest "A" category in the international festival rankings. Unfortunately, its highly beneficial cultural flame was extinguished after the changes of 1989, but with the efforts of the Varna Regional Red Cross Council, in collaboration with the Medical University and with the decisive support of the National Council of the Bulgarian Red Cross, the festival was revived in 2014 to once again light up the screen with a rich and diverse film program, along with many other parallel events. This is what the present XXI edition will also be like! We hope that not only the viewers in Varna, but also through the media across the entire country, will appreciate the significance and value of such a cultural event, especially important in the difficult times we are living in.

Festival and Congress Center – Varna has 10 multifunctional halls with a capacity of 50 to 1000 seats, a restaurant, cafe-bars and summer terraces, located under one roof on 4000 square meters on the busiest street in Varna – on the largo in front of the central entrance of the Sea Garden and only 50 meters from the beach promenade. Built in 1986 according to a project by arch. Kosyu Hristov, with its 80000 cubic meters, almost half of which is underground, with its clean lines and modern silhouette, its building looks both impressive and elegant and today is one of the architectural symbols of Varna. Events of various kinds are held daily in the halls of the Festival and Congress Center: film screenings, concerts, theater tours, literary readings, children's performances, art exhibitions, various exhibitions, conference events, seminars, company presentations, trainings, national and citywide celebrations, school holidays and corporate events. All of them create the image of the multifunctional complex as a center of events.













HUMANITY EVERY DAY IN A CHANGING WORLD

The International Festival of Red Cross and Health Films celebrates its 60th anniversary with a program that unites cinema, culture, and humanitarian values.

The XXIst edition of the festival will be held June 12 - 20, 2025, in Varna, Bulgaria, traditionally under the patronage of the Vice President of the Republic of Bulgaria, Mrs. Iliana Yotova. The motto of this year's edition—"Humanity Every Day in a Changing World"— emphasises the role of art as a means of dialogue and social change in the context of global challenges related to health, human dignity, and the environment.

The special poster created for the anniversary edition is the work of the renowned Bulgarian poster artist Dimitar Traychev, who presents his idea with the words: "Films heal emotional wounds."

The program of the anniversary edition of the festival includes 226 films from 63 countries, chosen from over 2,800 submitted productions. The films in the competition programme are selected by a committee chaired by Prof. Dr. Bozhidar Manov, artistic director of the festival. The program presents over 20 premiere titles, accompanied by meetings with their creative teams.

Particular attention is paid to the importance of cinema for special groups, as

part of the program includes Cinema for Children, with the aim of educating the younger generation in love for cinema and a critical attitude towards films. The special program "Silver Screen 60+" is aimed at viewers in their third age.

The festival also offers an Academy with training and workshops, a Discussion Forum for the exchange of ideas, a Panorama of awarded films from previous editions, and an interactive exhibition. The Cross Section initiative offers a meeting of genres and themes, while international events enhance the prestige of the festival and stimulate international cooperation.

The screenings take place in the Festival and Congress Center – Varna, distributed in four competition categories: feature films with a humanitarian focus, documentaries on the themes of medicine, healthcare, ecology, migration, human rights and disasters, health films with a focus on medicine and healthcare, and films of the Red Cross and Red Crescent, reflecting the activities of organisations around the world. Additional sections are dedicated to ecology, mental health, cultural integration, and the connection between art and sports.

The Artistic Director of the Festival is Prof. Dr. Bozhidar Manov. The international


jury, which evaluates the films in the competition program, includes leading eminent names from the world of cinema, culture, healthcare and humanitarian work. The Chairman of the jury is Denis Bojic from the Republic of Srpska, Bosnia and Herzegovina, a two-time laureate of the Festival for Best Film (2023) and Best Director (2019). Among the members are film directors Assoc. Prof. Martichka Bozhilova and Zlatina Teneva from Bulgaria, as well as producers Dimitar Dereliev -Darzi (Bulgaria) and Luis Valentí (Spain), creator director of the International Film Festival in Girona, Spain, actors Eli Skorcheva and Paraskeva Dzhukelova (Bulgaria), art critic and cultural manager Kamen Balkanski, as well as Giuseppe Cuscuzza from Italy – director of the International Film Festival COLIFFE in Rome, contribute their expertise. Representatives of the organisers also participate in the jury – Medical University

Varna and Bulgarian Red Cross.

Parallel to the competitive part, the festival offers a diverse accompanying program of meetings, discussions, and round tables, in which leading experts such as Kamen Balkanski, Prof. Tatyana Burudjieva, sociologist, Dr. Tsveteslava Galabova, psychologist, Pavlina Zheleva, film critic and producer, Prof. Alexander Doney, Georgi Cholakov, Borislav Chuchkov, producers, as well as actors from the series "Anxiety" – Iliyan Dzhevelekov, Ani Papadopulu, and Dr. Ivan Igov, psychologist, take part. The lectures are available online through the festival's YouTube channel, and viewers have the opportunity to ask questions via social media.

This year, special emphasis is placed on the possibilities for an ecological lifestyle in the modern urban environment. Innovations for urban transport with the help of shared electric bicycles from the

partners of Top Mobility are presented, care for the environment through planting flowers in small neglected spaces and the use of materials with a short lifespan, such as billboard vinyls from previous editions, to create durable and useful accessories such as bags and pencil cases.

During the festival, the campaign "Donate Blood - Get a Ticket" is held, organised jointly with the Regional Center for Transfusion Haematology. It is realised thanks to Vladislav Nikolov with the campaign "I believe and help", which collects plastic caps to support the purchase of life-saving medical equipment and specialised ambulances.

In 2025, Nikolov will be awarded the title "Honorary Citizen of Varna" for his charitable activities.

The anniversary edition of the festival includes a special Gala ceremony for donors, during which volunteers, blood donors, and organ donors receive well-deserved recognition. Within the festival, a special award is presented for contribution to cinema dedicated to humanity, which is awarded to actress Eli Skorcheva. She was

awarded for the main role twice at the festival for the films "Adaptation" (1979) and "Eva on the Third Floor" (1987).

The International Festival of Red Cross and Health Films (IFRCHF) was founded in 1965 and is the first of its kind international film forum in Bulgaria. The event is carried out with the support of UNESCO, the World Health Organisation, the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent, as well as the Bulgarian Red Cross. Thanks to its category "A" status from the International Federation of Film Producers Associations (FIAPF), it ranks among the





leading festivals in the world – on par with those in Cannes, Berlin, and Venice.

Its beginning was set in Varna, where one of the central cinemas hosts an international film review on the occasion of the 80th anniversary of the Bulgarian Red Cross. Within a week, 53 productions from 16 countries, dedicated to health topics and humanitarian causes, are presented. The films are evaluated by an international jury, and most of them are the work of national Red Cross societies and health education institutions.

Spurred by the enthusiasm of organisers and participants – doctors, film creators and humanitarian workers – the idea arises to establish the event as a regular international festival. It is decided to be held once every two years and to include television and feature films with a social and medical orientation. The organisation is taken over by the Central Committee of the BRC, and international support comes from the then League (now Federation) of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies, WHO, and UNESCO. It is usually held in the months of May or June.

The festival receives the highest international rating from other institutions, such as the International Federation of Film Critics (CIDALK). This prestige places it among forums of the highest class such as those in Venice, San Sebastian, and others.

The festival developed intensively until 1991, when it was interrupted due to changes in the socio-political environment. After more than two decades of pause, in 2014 it was restored on the initiative of the Bulgarian Red Cross, Medical University - Varna, and Iliya Raev with a renewed concept and expanded international scope.

The "International Festival of Red Cross and Health Films" foundation was established by the BRC and MU – Varna, with a governing body and secretariat. Mr. Ilko Raev was elected as the director creator of numerous international forums, including the film festival "Love is Folly." From the very beginning, the motto of the festival - "Through Humanity to Friendship and Peace" - inspires its program and continues to guide it today, as the power of cinema is used to focus on important social themes such as healthcare, human rights,





ecology, migration and personal destinies. The aims of the forum are aimed at supporting the humanitarian principles of the Red Cross, promoting tolerance, cooperation and intercultural dialogue, stimulating social integration and the development of personal and professional potential, as well as forming values and respect for human life.

The festival is a biennial, which after its restoration is under the patronage of the Vice President of the Republic of Bulgaria. In 2015, the Academy of the festival was created - an educational format that combines lectures, workshops and a specially selected film program for professionals and the general public. In recent years, it has expanded its scope with the initiative "Traveling Festival Panorama", through which selected films are presented in various cities and universities in the country, with the aim of engaging a wider audience and inspiring young people with humanitarian themes.

The festival is establishing itself as a sustainable cultural model, which actively contributes to the revitalisation of the artistic scene in Varna. Through an interdisciplinary program combining cinema, science, photography and performing arts, connections are built between culture, society and nature - in the spirit of the "New European Bauhaus" initiative.

Evidence of the festival's growing authority are the six regular editions and five academies with a rich accompanying program:

- * in 2014, the fifteenth edition, 125 film productions from 20 countries participated;
- * in 2015 145 films from 25 countries participated;
- * in 2017 1890 films from 107 countries were submitted for the competition, 201 from 49 countries were selected;
 - * in 2019 a record of over 3000 films

from 118 countries, 206 were selected from 59 countries;

- * in 2021 1281 films from 101 countries, 68 were selected from 18 countries;
- * in 2023 1416 films from 92 countries, 30 films were selected from 21 countries.

The Film Academy is held in the years between the competition editions under the title "Aggression – Humanity – Cinema". It presents non-competitive films that put important humanitarian problems on the agenda. The discussion forums, in which the topics set by the screen and by society are discussed by representatives of the Red Cross, filmmakers, leading doctors, sociologists, psychologists, journalists and an active audience, are particularly valuable. Through partnerships with leading media, these conversations reach a wide audience and contribute to the popularization of Red Cross ideas.

These data show that society not only continues to be interested in the idea embedded in the festival's motto - "Through humanism to friendship and peace"-but also actively supports it.

BULGARIAN RED CROSS

The Bulgarian Red Cross carries out its activities in fulfillment of its main goal to alleviate and prevent human suffering with impartiality and neutrality, without making any distinction as to nationality or race, gender, social status, religious beliefs or political views. The Bulgarian Red Cross is part of the International Red Cross Movement and is guided by its fundamental principles: neutrality, humanism, impartiality, independence, voluntariness, unity and universality. Through its network of volunteers throughout the country, the BRC supports vulnerable people in disaster and crisis situations. Through activities for the benefit of society, it contributes to the alleviation and prevention of suffering in all its

forms, protects health and life and ensures respect for the human person. In fulfillment of its humanitarian mission, the BRC implements activities related to reducing the vulnerability and social exclusion of the most needy in order to improve their quality of life, provides services and conducts campaigns and trainings related to protecting the life and health of people - in first aid, in road safety prevention, etc.The Bulgarian Red Cross assists the state in the event of disasters, accidents, crises and military conflicts. The organization is part of the country's Unified Rescue System. The Bulgarian Youth Red Cross, through its thousands of volunteers, carries out activities throughout the country to promote humanitarian values, prevent violence and socially significant diseases, educate children and young people in a healthy lifestyle, first aid, psychological first aid and psychosocial support. The Bulgarian Red Cross provides assistance through the Mountain Rescue Service to victims of incidents in the mountains, and the Water Rescue Service trains qualified water rescuers and works to prevent water trauma.



Denis Bojic *Republika Srpska* chairman

Denis Bojić (born in Bjelovar, Croatia) is a film director, screenwriter and journalist from Republika Srpska. He graduated from the Faculty of Philosophy in Banja Luka, majoring in journalism, and is defending his master's thesis in the field of political analytics, focusing on the role of civil society in democratic processes in Bosnia and Herzegovina. Since 2013, he has been working in the documentary department of Radio Television Republika Srpska (RTRS). He is currently the director of the Memorial Center of Republika Srpska, Bosnia and Herzegovina.

Bojić is the author of a number of documentaries, including Vukovar Blues, Children and Faces of Lafora. The film Faces of Lafora (2017) follows a family's struggle against the rare genetic disease Lafora disease and was presented in the French Senate and the European Parliament.

The film Children received the main award "Golden Knight" at the Russian festival of the same name. In 2021 Bojic received a special recognition from UNICEF for the film "Some New Broadway", which tells the story of young people with Down syndrome participating in a theater company. In 2023, his film "Some New Broadway" won the award for best documentary in the field of health at the International Film Festival "Golden FEMI" in Sofia. Denis Bojic is a two-time winner of the IFCHF Best Director award. His work is distinguished by deep humanity, social commitment and a desire for change through the power of documentary cinema.



Prof. Martichka Bozhilova *Bulgaria*

Assoc. Prof. Martichka Bozhilova is a lawyer, theologian, art manager, curator and lecturer in "Film and Television Production". She is the founder and director of the production house AGITPROP, one of the most innovative film companies in Southeast Europe, winner of numerous international awards.

She produced the documentaries "George and the Butterflies", "The Mosquito Problem and Other Stories", "Corridor No. 8", "Concrete Pharaohs" and "Hotel Paradise" - the first original Bulgarian productions for HBO. She is also one of the producers of the first Bulgarian omnibus film "15".

She is the winner of the prestigious International Trailblazer Award, awarded by Robert Redford and the Sundance Channel in 2006 in Cannes, for her contribution to contemporary documentary cinema.

Assoc. Bozhilova is the director of the Balkan Documentary Center, a lecturer at European workshops, the official representative of the European Documentary Network (EDN) for Bulgaria, and the producer of the documentary film Bear with Me – the first Bulgarian finalist at the Content Warsaw 2024 forum.





Zlatina Teneva *Bulgaria*

Zlatina Teneva is a Bulgarian documentary filmmaker, director, and producer. She graduated in journalism from Sofia University "St. Kliment Ohridski" and has worked as a director and researcher on projects for ARTE and Deutsche Welle. In 2020, she participated in the prestigious European documentary workshop DOC Campus.

Her directorial debut, "A Provincial Hospital" (2022), co-directed with Iliyan Metev and Ivan Chertov, was presented in the main competition program of the Karlovy Vary International Film Festival and won the Ecumenical Jury Prize. The film was awarded Best Film at the International Festival of Red Cross and Health Films (IFRCHF) in 2023.

Zlatina Teneva is part of the new generation of socially engaged authors in Bulgarian documentary cinema, combining journalistic insight and cinematic sensitivity.



Dimitar Dereiev - Darzi *Bulgaria*

Dimitar Dereliev – Darzi is a Bulgarian producer, screenwriter, and director, born in Asenovgrad. He graduated in law from Sofia University (1980) and specialised in electronic media in London (1995).

He is the founder and director of the National Film Center (1991–1999, 2002–2003). Over the years, he has held numerous key positions in the cultural and film sphere: member of the interim National Council for Radio and Television (1992–1997), chairman of the "Filmautor" Association (2000–2001), member of the Board of Directors of "New Boyana Film" (2006–2009, 2011–2018), lecturer at NATFIZ "Krustyo Sarafov" in the discipline "Entrepreneurship in Audiovisual Production," as well as founder and member of the Management Board of the Bulgarian Film Institute.

He is also the founder and director of Studio Zmei – an animation studio inspired by Balkan folklore and traditions. Dereliev is a member of the Bulgarian Association of Film and Television Directors (BAFTRS). In 2009, he was appointed Deputy Minister of Culture in the government of Minister Vezhdi Rashidov, responsible for cultural policy and creative industries.

In 2016, he participated as an assistant producer in the short documentary film "Bulgaria: Cradle of Civilization."

Dimitar Dereliev is the author of more than forty documentary films, editor of over a hundred films, and in recent years has been a consultant for documentary and feature films.





Paraskeva Dzhukelova *Bulgaria*

Paraskeva Dzhukelova is well known to the audience for her roles in films such as "Elevation", "Gundy-Legend of Love", "Without Wings", "Incineration", "The Naked Truth about a Zhiguli Group", in which she recreates characters that have left a deep mark on contemporary Bulgarian cinema.

She plays at the National Theater "Ivan Vazov" (1992 - 1997), the Satirical Theater "Aleko Konstantinov", the Municipal Theater "Vazrazhdane" and the Theater "Bulgarian Army".

She also has roles in foreign film productions such as "Versengentorix" (2001), "Air Marshal" and "I Am David" (2003), "Icon" (2005), where she partnered with Patrick Swayze), "The Abandoned" (2006). Paraskeva Dzhukelova received the Grand Prize "Golden Rose" for best female role in the films "Season of the Canary Birds" (dir. Evgeniy Mikhailov, 1994) and "Incineration" (dir. Strahil Blagoev, 2004). She has received awards from theater festivals, as well as recognition from the guild and the audience.

Actively supports a number of social, cultural and humanitarian causes. Supports civic initiatives and cultural policies.

"With great excitement I join the jury of this festival, which has a unique significance in supporting the values of solidarity and humanity. Cinema is a powerful tool for social change and I am happy to be part of this important initiative," says Paraskeva Dzhukelova.



Eli Skorcheva *Bulgaria*

Eli Skorcheva is a Bulgarian actress with a bright presence in cinema, theatre, and television. From her first roles, she ranks among the most memorable faces of Bulgarian cinema from the 1980s.

Her career began with exceptional success and led to participation in emblematic films such as "Boris I," "Ladies Choice," "Hotel Central," and "Adio, Rio." Among her most famous roles are Veronica and Tony in the films "Adaptation" (1979) and "Eva on the Third Floor" (1987), for which she won the awards for Best Actress at both editions of the International Festival of Red Cross and Health Films. She combines her artistic strength with screen charisma, which makes her one of the most recognisable actresses of her generation.

After a long hiatus from the stage and cameras, Skorcheva makes a remarkable return with the lead role in "Blaga's Lessons" (dir. Stefan Komandarev, 2023) — a film that wins the Grand Prize "Crystal Globe" for Best Film at the Karlovy Vary International Film Festival. For her role, Skorcheva received the award for Best Actress, which confirms her status as an actress of exceptional class. Recognition is not delayed in the public sphere either – she is declared "Person of the Day" by Radio Free Europe.





Luis Valentí *Spain*

Lluís Valentí is a Spanish director, screenwriter, producer, and cultural organiser with a long-standing contribution to European and Latin American cinema. He is the founder and director of the Girona Film Festival, which since 1989 has established itself as one of the most prestigious platforms for discovering new talent in cinema, with a focus on films with humanistic and social themes.

Valentí is the founder of the Catalan Film Academy, as well as several significant awards: Premis Barcelona, Premis Carles Duran, Premis Xavier Cugat, and Mexican Talents Awards. He is the director of the College of Film Directors in Catalonia and represents Catalonia in the Assembly of the Federation of European Film Directors (FERA).

As a producer, Valentí has worked on over 60 films, including the last three films by director Josep Maria Nunes and "Azaña" by Santiago San Miguel. In 1992, he founded the production company Valentí Films, which focuses on auteur and reflective cinema. In 2005, he merged the activities of this company with the distribution company Versus Films, specialising in the distribution of dramatic, comedy, and documentary films in Spain.

Valentí holds a doctorate in art history from the University of Barcelona. He has taught cinema at prestigious institutions in Mexico.

His work is aimed at promoting cultural diversity and social engagement in cinema, providing a platform for new voices and perspectives in world cinematography.



Giuseppe Cuscusa Italv

Giuseppe Cuscuzza is an Italian cultural activist, an established expert in the field of marketing and communications, with extensive experience in the political and institutional sector, sports, and cinema, president of the APS Pianeta Empatia association.

He is a producer, as well as the founder and president of COLIFFE – Coliseum International Film Festival in Rome – a forum dedicated to independent cinema and new voices in directing, which emphasises the social role of the seventh art.

An active advocate for social and environmental causes through cultural platforms, in 2024 Cuscuzza is a member of the jury of the 36th edition of the Girona Film Festival in Spain. In addition to his activities in cinema, he is also involved in sports civic participation through the MyROMA – Supporters Trust organisation, where he holds a leadership position.





Kamen Balkanski *Bulgaria*

Kamen Balkanski is an art historian and cultural manager with diverse interests in the field of contemporary art. He holds a Master's degree from the National Academy of Arts, which he graduated from in 1994. From 1997 to 2002, he was the executive director of the CIS Foundation for Contemporary Art, and in 2002-2003 he lectured at the National Academy of Arts in Sofia. In the same year, he became the administrative director of "Television MM", and from 2004-2006 he was an advisor to the managers of the same television.

In 2004, he started working as the director of the MEDIA program office of the EU in Bulgaria. From 2015 to 2017 and from 2021 to the beginning of 2022, he was the executive director of the National Film Center. He is currently the head of the "Creative Europe MEDIA" office—Bulgaria.



Ivelina Martinova *Bulgaria*

Ivelina Martinova was born in Varna in 1974. Her first contact with cinema took place at the magical Summer Cinema in the city. She graduated from French Philology in Sofia. She works as an assistant director of feature and documentary films in France, Italy and Lithuania. In Bulgaria, she works with the production companies Sofilm, New Image, Eyevision, Belle Epoque. She writes and translates for Bulgarian and French publications: Dolce far'niente, Perfect day, le Monde, l'Express. Since 2014, she has been working on the project to create a university television at the Medical University - Varna and is currently responsible for the specialized program of the media. Outside of work, she can most often be found with her phone turned off in a far seat in a darkened cinema.

The topic of "Mental health in society" through the lens of cinema will be presented by **Dr. Tsveteslava Galabova**, psychiatrist.

She graduated from the Medical University in Sofia (1992) and earned a degree in Business Administration at UNWE (2006). Since 1994, she has worked at the National Psychiatric Hospital "St. Ivan Rilski" in Kurilo, starting as a resident and advancing to head of the men's ward for acute psychoses. Since 2009, she has been the hospital's director. Since 2003, she also practices outpatient psychiatry. Dr. Galabova has served as a forensic psychiatric expert for over 20 years and is the national expert in psychiatry for the Bulgarian Medical Association.

As the head of one of the largest psychiatric hospitals in the country, Dr. Galabova is a vocal advocate on issues of mental health in Bulgaria. She frequently voices concern about the rising levels of addiction among Bulgarians and the overall decline in national well-being. During the COVID-19 pandemic, she joined the Medical Council on Coronavirus, offering valuable advice on coping with stress and anxiety. She pays

special attention to emotional intelligence and the importance of real human connection in the digital age.

As part of the festival, film lovers will have the opportunity to meet the creators and main cast of the series "Anxiety", and engage in a first-person conversation about its message and the major issues it raises. The series focuses on urgent and deeply personal questions—mental health, family dynamics, and the challenges facing young people in modern society.

The project is produced by Miramar Studio and directed by Ilian Djevelekov. With its strong psychological depth and impressive performances, led by Ani Papadopulu, "Anxiety" stands out as both impactful and socially relevant. Joining them at the 21st International Festival of Red Cross and Health Films is the content consultant for the series—renowned psychologist Ivan Igov.

Ilian Djevelekov is a Bulgarian director, screenwriter, and producer.

He began his studies in psychology at Sofia University and later graduated in film and television directing from the National

Academy for Theatre and Film Arts under Acad. Lyudmil Staykov. During his studies, he worked as a director for the student program Ku-ku.

In 1993, his short film I Want to Be Free won Best Short Film at the Golden Rose International Film Festival in Varna. From 1994 to 2000, Djevelekov worked as a producer and director at Ku-ku Film.

In 2001, along with Matey Konstantinov and Georgi Dimitrov, he founded the production company Miramar Film, which is now one of the leading studios in Bulgaria for fiction, documentary films, and TV commercials.

Djevelekov's debut as a feature film producer was Zift (2008), directed by Yavor Gardev. The film won the Silver Saint George at the Moscow International Film Festival and the Golden Rose at the Bulgarian Film Festival in Varna, and went on to appear at numerous prestigious international festivals.

His directorial debut came with the film LOVE.NET, released in 2011. With more than 206,000 viewers, it ranks among the ten most successful Bulgarian films of all

time in box office revenue. At the Golden Rose Festival, the film won awards for Best Actress (Lilia Maraviglia), Best Screenplay (Nelly Dimitrova, Matey Konstantinov, Ilian Djevelekov), and Best Directorial Debut.

Ana Papadopulu is a distinguished Bulgarian stage, film, and television actress.

She graduated in acting from NATFA "Krastyo Sarafov" in 2000, in the class of Prof. Stefan Danailov. Still a student, she made her debut at the Ivan Vazov National Theatre in the role of Anna in The Lower Depths by Maxim Gorky, directed by Alexander Morfov.

Since then, she has been a permanent member of the theatre troupe, building a remarkable career with dozens of roles in classic and contemporary plays. Her most iconic performances include Beatrice in Decameron or Blood and Passion by Boccaccio, Salome in Salome by Oscar Wilde, Adela in The House of Bernarda Alba, Anna Petrovna in Ivanov, Anya in The Cherry Orchard, Julie in Jake's Women, and Perdita in The Winter's Tale.

Alongside her theatre work, Papadopulu has developed a strong film and TV career. Among her notable roles are in Letter to America (2000), The World is Big and Salvation Lurks Around the Corner (2008), Mission London (2010), The Petrov File (2015), and Monkey (2016), as well as in the TV series Stolen Life, Missing Persons Unit, and Fourth Estate.

For her role in Letter to America, she received the "Nevena Kokanova" Debut Award (2001), and in 2018, she was honored with the "Askeer" award for Best Supporting Actress in The Little Foxes.

In 2024, she plays the role of Dr. Magdalena Yasenova, a child psychologist, in the series Anxiety, which explores themes of mental health and the struggles of today's youth.

He is the author of textbooks and publications, as well as the national standards for psychology education in secondary schools. As the coordinator of the "School Without Violence" project by UNICEF and the Ministry of Education, Igov has worked to improve school environments and prevent violence.

In 2024, he serves as a psychological consultant on the TV series Anxiety, which explores significant social themes related to mental health and the problems facing young people. His expertise ensures psychological authenticity and depth in the production.

As a producer, Pavlina Zheleva is co-founder of the film company Geopoli and has been involved in successful projects such as Requiem for Mrs. J and Miracle. These films have been featured at industry platforms like Mannheim-Heidelberg and received international recognition.

In 2017, Zheleva chaired the jury of the Golden Rhyton festival, where she evaluated documentary and animated films. She plays a key role in the development of Bulgarian cinema, supporting emerging talents and fostering critical thought in the industry.




Prof. Alexander Donev is a prominent Bulgarian film critic and artistic director of the International Film Festival Golden Rose.

As artistic director of the Golden Rose festival, Prof. Donev is responsible for film selection and program design, with a focus on innovative and socially engaged projects. He plays a crucial role in the development and promotion of Bulgarian cinema on the international stage. Prof. Donev is not only a critic but also a mentor and inspiration to a new generation of Bulgarian filmmakers.





Georgi Cholakov is an established Bulgarian cinematographer, producer, and cultural figure with over four decades of experience in the film industry.

He graduated in cinematography from VITIZ "Krastyo Sarafov" and built a rich creative portfolio with numerous documentaries and feature films noted for their strong aesthetics and social relevance.

He represented Bulgaria in Eurimages (1993–1995). Between 1991 and 1995, Cholakov served as deputy director of the National Film Center, and from 2014 to 2015, as its executive director. As the head of the institution, he actively supported auteur cinema and worked to improve film production mechanisms in Bulgaria.

Over the years, he has produced and shot several significant Bulgarian productions, including the documentary The Poet Shoots at His Heart (2012), acclaimed for its profound portrayal of Bulgarian poets' lives and work. He is also the founder of the production company Geopoli and is known for his dedication to cultural causes, young creators, and the sustainable development of national cinema.

His professionalism, critical eye, and longstanding commitment to Bulgarian film art place him among the leading figures in the contemporary film scene of the country.



Borislav Chuchkov is a Bulgarian producer, director, and actor with an active presence in contemporary cinema and television.

He graduated in acting from NATFA "Krastyo Sarafov" and later specialized in audiovisual management, allowing him to develop a successful career both in front of and behind the camera.

In 2003, together with his brother—the director Viktor Chuchkov Jr.—he founded the production company Chouchkov Brothers. The two are behind several key titles in Bulgarian cinema, such as TILT (2011), Bulgaria's submission for the Oscars, 18% Grey (2020), Singing Shoes (2016), and Shakespeare Like a Street Dog (2023). Their films are known for their strong visual style, contemporary language, and social sensitivity.

Borislav Chuchkov also contributes to television production, and in recent years, he has returned to acting. He is an active figure in the cultural scene, co-organizing events like Sofia Summer Fest and being involved in the management of the Dom na Kinoto (House of Cinema) in Sofia.

With his visionary energy and creative approach, Borislav Chuchkov is among the key figures shaping modern Bulgarian cinema.







Prof. Stanimir Trifonov is a Bulgarian director, screenwriter, and producer.

In 1986–1987, he worked as a director at Bulgarian National Television. From 1987 to 1993, he was a director at the Studio for Popular Science and Documentary Films Vreme, where he served as artistic director until 1999. From 2002 to 2010, he was the studio's director. He teaches film and television directing at the South-West University "Neofit Rilski" and film and television arts at the New Bulgarian University.

His first documentary Until Tomorrow... Four Portraits and One Memory premiered on May 8, 1988, in Veliko Tarnovo.

He has directed both documentaries and feature films, including:

Elias Canetti. Reply to a Letter (1992, winner of the "Silver Rhyton"), An Impossible Image (1996, Golden Rose), the TV series Wolf Hunt (2000, Golden Chest), as well as Burning Out (2004, Golden Rose),

On the Border (2015, Best TV Series by the Bulgarian Film Academy), The Glass River, and others.

Iskra Radeva is a well-known Bulgarian actress.

She graduated from VITIZ in Acting for Dramatic Theatre under Apostol Karamitev and immediately joined the Youth Theatre's troupe. In the 1980s and 1990s, she was active in dubbing TV series for BNT—her most famous voice role was Meggie Cleary in The Thorn Birds. She also worked on the dubbing of Rich Man, Poor Man and Return to Eden. In the 1990s, she became active in show business, pop music, and chamber performances, writing lyrics and show scripts.

In 1997, she left the Youth Theatre and in 1999 founded her own company—Iskri i sezoni ("Sparks and Seasons"), taking on the roles of producer and director. In 2000, she staged the show Goodbye, 20th Century, and her production company IRD organized some of the biggest show performances in Bulgaria. She has played numerous roles in theatre, television drama, film, and TV.





Olga Markova is a prominent Bulgarian film critic.

She holds degrees in philology and journalism. With a PhD in film studies, she works as an art critic and journalist specializing in arts and culture. She is the author of ten books, most of them devoted to cinema. Some, like The Role of Bulgarian Culture in World Civilization, have been translated into English and distributed through Bulgarian embassies and cultural centers worldwide.

For her two extensive volumes Masters of the Great Cinema and The Last Mohicans of Cinema, she received the "Golden Feather" from the Union of Bulgarian Journalists, as well as the Golden Diploma Pedestal for Distinguished Film Critic at the Golden Knight forum in Russia. In 2019, she published the third part of the trilogy: The Last Become First.

For over a decade, she has taught a course on Literature, Cinema, and Visual Culture in the master's program at Sofia University "St. Kliment Ohridski." In her long career, she has served as an editor in Information for Abroad at BTA, as head of the "Art" department for 25 years at the national weekly Puls, and as founder and editor-inchief of the national weekly Az-Buki, where she received multiple awards.

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

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On June 10, 2025, a special minibus will stop in front of the Festival Complex in Varna. This is the mobile blood donation station "I believe and help". There you will be able to donate blood, in return for which you will receive a ticket for two to a film from the festival program.







The charity campaign "I Believe and Help" was created in 2015 in the city of Varna as a small neighborhood campaign and is the first in Bulgaria and the longest-running one for collecting plastic caps to help premature babies.

To date, the campaign has collected and handed over for recycling over 341,500,000 kilograms of plastic caps and donated over 25 medical devices, equipment, machinery, hundreds of accessories and tools, the unique children's/neonatal ambulance "I Believe and Help" and the first specialized mobile blood donation point in Bulgaria "I Believe and Help".


Let's say "YES" to Free, Regular and Voluntary Blood Donation in the city of Varna and the region

ELI SKORCHEVA

Eli Skorcheva is a Bulgarian film, television and theater actress, born on March 8, 1954 in Plovdiv. She graduated from a technical school in construction and architecture, then studied acting at the VITIZ "Krustyo Sarafov", graduating in 1977 in the class of Prof. Nadezhda Seikova.

She made her screen debut in 1974 in the television series "The Blue Lamp". Her first significant success came with the leading role of Veronika in the television drama "Adaptation" (1979) directed by Valo Radev. This role established her as one of the most promising actresses of her generation.

In the 1980s, she starred in a number of films, including "The Queen of Tarnovo" (1981), "Constantine the Philosopher" (1983), "In the Name of the People" (1984), "Eve on the Third Floor" (1987) and "Madame Bovary from Sliven" (1991). Characteristic of her performances are the psychological depth and restrained emotionality.

In the early 1990s, Skorcheva retired from active acting, disappointed by the compromise proposals and the state of Bulgarian cinema and theater at that time. In the following decades, she worked in the insurance sector and rarely appeared in public.

In 2023, she made an impressive comeback with the main role in the social drama "Blaga's Lessons" directed by Stefan Komandarev. Skorcheva's performance was highly praised, with her receiving the Best Actress award at the 57th Karlovy Vary International Film Festival, and the film winning the Crystal Globe Grand Prize. Eli Skorcheva remains one of the most memorable actresses in Bulgarian cinema, known for her magnetic presence and deep, emotionally charged roles.
